### **FUND SPOTLIGHTS**



#### **UTLEY CHILDREN'S FUND**

The Utley Children's Fund was established in 1999 by the late George and Frances Utley. George and Fran had a passion for helping children in our community and started this fund as a resource for those in need. The fund provides footwear and/or medicine for kindergarten through sixth grade children from low-income families who attend the following public school districts in Fairfield County: Lancaster City Schools, Amanda-Clearcreek, Berne Union, Bloom-Carroll, Fairfield Union, Liberty Union and Walnut Township.



George Utley worked for the Drew Shoe Company, located in Lancaster, Ohio, which specializes in shoes for individuals who require special care including diabetic, arthritic, and other types of medical conditions. The Utley's passion for footwear is what drove their decision to open the Children's Fund with a focus on providing shoes for local children in need.

Recommendations for funding for shoes and/or medications can be submitted by school principals, school counselors, school nurses and community leaders.
