Bleu George Memorial Fund

The Bleu George Memorial Fund was established by the parents of Bleu



George to honor his life and love for all things golf. Bleu was a graduate of Fisher Catholic High School, where he was a state runner up in basketball and a two-time state qualifier in golf. He attended Tiffin University and then Wittenberg University, both under a golf scholarship.



After graduating, Bleu joined the PGA School of Golf under the apprentice program while working at several golf courses in central Ohio—including his home course in Lancaster. During that time, he won the 14th Southern Ohio PGA Open, took first place in the Apprentice Tour Match Play Championship and tied for first place in the SOPGA Chapter Challenge in 2017. Bleu ultimately landed at Venice Golf and Country Club in Florida, where he worked for the last two-plus years. While there, he won the North Florida Section Assistant Championship. Above all else, Bleu loved his friends and family and stayed in contact often and always offered words of encouragement. Bleu was an organ donor, and through his brave generosity, helped twenty people and saved at least two lives.

The Bleu George Memorial Fund will be two-fold. The fund will award college scholarships to high school golfers in Fairfield County as well as help fund a memorial garden at Valley View Golf Club.

This past fall, Bleu's parents, Barbi and Cory, hosted the first Bleu George Memorial—a golf tournament to raise money for Bleu's fund. They had tremendous success—raising over \$4,000. They look forward to making this an annual event and continuing to honor Bleu's legacy for years to come.

Review

If your application is fully submitted by **Friday, February 17** the staff will review your application for completeness and email you with any issues by March 1. This will allow applicants to correct any problems before the final deadline on Friday, March 10. You will not receive an email if everything is filled out correctly. You may submit your application without the third party documents (transcripts or letters of reference). High school counselors are asked to wait until after the first semester grades are posted to submit transcripts for graduating high school seniors.

Youth Advisory Committee Grant Application is Open



The 2022-2023 Youth Advisory Committee is now accepting grant applications for the 2023 year! The current committee met twice in 2022, with over 15 students participating from schools throughout the county. During these two meetings, the Foundation staff has discussed the purpose of a community foundation, how they operate and how they support nonprofits in the area through grants. The committee has also heard from leaders at Salvation Army and American Red Cross, who have graciously hosted meetings at their space. During our next two meetings, students will be hearing from Harcum House and Geneva Hills about ways their nonprofit organizations serve our community and how youth can get involved.

This grant cycle will provide hands-on experience to educate committee members about how grants are collected, evaluated and funded. Any nonprofit serving Fairfield County with a youth-related project can apply for up to \$2,000 through this committee. The deadline to submit applications is January 31. Grant Supports Painting and Repair Projects at Georgian Museum

The Fairfield County Foundation recently awarded a grant from the Wendel Family Fund to the Fairfield County Heritage Association for the Georgian Museum Repair and Repainting Project.

The Fairfield County Heritage Association is responsible for the restoration and preservation of the Georgian House in Downtown Lancaster which is visited by 1,500-2,000 people annually. To maintain the structural integrity of the building, all gutters, eaves, downspouts, windows, and columns were repaired and repainted. The shutters were also repaired or replaced as needed, and all other exterior trim received a fresh coat of paint.

Previously, there were issues allowing rain and snow to get into the wood trim in the eaves of the building. This was causing problems with peeling paint and rotting wood. All downspouts were checked and all leaks were repaired to avoid future foundation issues.

This grant allowed them to resolve these issues in a timely manner to prevent further damage and preserve a valuable piece of Fairfield County history. The museum was able to maintain regular tours and open hours during the maintenance of the building. The Fairfield County Foundation is proud to be a supporter of the Fairfield County Heritage Association.
