## Scholarship Update



### FAFSA for 2023-2024 School Year Opens October 1

The Fairfield County Foundation scholarship application requires each applicant to upload a copy of the first page of their Student Aid Report (SAR) each year. Students obtain this report by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) each year. The scholarship review committees take this into consideration when determining financial need of applicants. ### **Fairfield County Foundation Grant Supports Wheelchair Ramp and Home Modification Program**

The Fairfield County Foundation recently awarded a grant from the Terry A. McGhee/Sally J. Grimm Community Fund to the Fairfield Center for disAbilities and Cerebral Palsy (FCdCP) for their Home Modification and Ramp Program.

"Words cannot express the magnitude of the Wheelchair Ramp and Home Modification Program. The Center is proud to provide safe access to and from community members' homes by installing ramps and making home modifications" said Tara Layne, Director of Operations of FCdCP.



As a result of this program, more than 105 individuals who could not enter or exit their homes previously are able to have the opportunity to access daily necessities, live a healthier, more independent life, and engage meaningfully within their community with increased social wellness.

The Smart Team is a volunteer group comprised of faithful community members. Without them, this project to improve the quality of life for so many Fairfield County residents would not have been possible. This team coordinates needed materials, drafts blueprints, and builds ramps and other home modifications, as needed. Staff from FCdCP are also onsite with them to help in this effort. These volunteers, with the support of the Fairfield County Foundation, are building a lasting legacy in the community and are enhancing the quality of life in Fairfield County.
